Carpark

Thank you for your co-operation with regard to the implementation of carpark rules. It is imperative that you continue to observe the rules <u>ALL</u> of the time in order to ensure the safety of all. Please **do not** walk through or park in staff carpark when picking up children as this area must be kept free for school buses. It has come to my attention that some parents persist in parking in the staff carpark. This cannot continue for health & safety purposes. Pedestrians are requested to use the pedestrian gate at the front of the school and the ramp from the carpark. Pedestrians should not use the main school entrance under any circumstances. It is unacceptable to pick up your child in the outside lane of the drive-through area. You must be stationery in the set down area. Parents have a responsibility to ensure these rules are observed. As we approach the winter season it is important to be mindful of the carpark/front entrance yard and paths on frosty mornings. The path will be salted but extreme care should be exercised.

Maths Week

At Cloonakilla NS we aim to instil a love of Maths and we encourage our pupils to use Maths with confidence in their daily lives. Our annual Maths Week took place from Monday, October 14th - Friday, October 18th. Class teachers planned additional and varied maths activities and Special Education Teachers and myself conducted maths lessons in all classes. Middle and senior classes were encouraged to solve a word problem of the day. During the week children were encouraged to use their "Maths Eyes" at home and in school.

Implementation of the new Primary Maths Curriculum commences this school year. The aim of the new curriculum is that children see maths as important and useful to their everyday lives. It does not change much of 'what' children learn, but it improves 'how' children learn maths. This includes more learning through play and problem solving. It also provides more opportunities for children to be creative, take risks and be challenged. As a school, we will focus on the pedagogical practice "Encouraging Playfulness" for this term. This annual event is a fantastic opportunity for students to dive into the world of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) through engaging activities, workshops, and experiments. This year we will emphasise how scientific thinking drives progress in various fields and how students can use their curiosity to explore new possibilities. SEN Teachers and myself conducted additional experiments in all classes. Children had an opportunity to showcase their experiments to other classes on Friday in the assembly hall.

Gaelbhratach

As of September 2024, Cloonakilla NS is participating in the Gaelbhratach initiative, with the aim of building on confidence and positive attitudes towards speaking Irish (Gaeilge Ó Bhéal) in the whole school community. A Coiste Gaeilge has been founded with 16 children from 3rd to 6th Class and they will help identify fun ways to incorporate the use of Irish into whole school events on our calendar and build on the visibility and use of the language informally in our school. We aim to fulfill a number of criteria which will ensure we have the Gaelbhratach (flag for the promotion of the Irish language) flying in Cloonakilla soon!

Internet Safety

As an extension of the Anti-Bullying theme which was covered in September as part of the SPHE Curriculum teachers in 3rd-6th classes will cover Cyberbullying for the month of November. David Dully (An Garda Siochana) will address the pupils in 5th & 6th classes next week on Internet Safety. His aim is to equip children with the knowledge to ensure their online behaviours protect them from the negative impacts of technology while allowing them to benefit from the advantages.David is a parent in our school and I would like to thank him most sincerely for giving of his time and expertise for the benefit of our pupils.

Student Council

The Student Council is a key part of our school, representing student voices and working to improve school life for everyone. Made up of a dedicated team of students from 6th class, the council focuses on organizing events, raising awareness on important issues, and fostering a positive school environment. So far this year, they have focused on listening to the opinions and suggestions of all the students in the school and promoting well-being and inclusion in the schoolyard. The student council meet monthly with Ms Kelly and myself to identify priorities and address needs. I have been very impressed by their maturity and work ethic and I look forward to working with them for the year ahead.



Special Educational Needs (SEN)

The SEN team are working with class teachers and pupils to support literacy and numeracy throughout the school through a number of initiatives. Guided Reading is supported from 1st class to 6th class. Literacy Lift Off is being delivered to 1st Class in Term 1. It will move to Senior Infants in Terms 2 and 3. The Reading Recovery Programme is also offered to children with emergent literacy needs. Mrs McCabe is our Reading Recovery Teacher. The SEN Team also respond to and support children with social, emotional and behavioural needs with transient to long term interventions. We appreciate the ongoing support of parents which adds to the success of all these initiatives. Under

The National Educational Psychological Services (NEPS) Dr Mary Kate Roche continues to work with us to support teaching and learning in our school. Children who receive a diagnosis during the school year are monitored and can be placed on the Continum of Support at a level that best meets their needs be that Classroom Support, School Support or School Support Plus.

School Self Evaluation

As part of School Self Evaluation we are continuing to focus on Spelling. Spellings for Me Programme is in Year 2 of its implementation in 2nd- 6th classes as is the Heggerty Phonemic Awareness Programme in the Infant classes. This programme aims to develop phonological and phonemic awareness skills. We are also focussing on a whole school approach to the development of Music. Our 3 year School Improvement Plan (2023-2026) is available on our school website . Year 2 of this plan continues to focus on developing musical literacy in all classes.

Local History

3rd - 6th classes have been studying the history of our local area as part of the History Curriculum with heritage expert Martin Curley. Martin led them on historical trails of the local area which included fieldtrips to significant historical features such as Meehambee Dolmen, Cloonakilla Graveyard and St Ruth's Castle.

1st & 2nd class completed a nature trail within their immediate school environment. Study of local history enables pupils to investigate and learn about the past and to form connections between past and present.

Buddy Programme

Cloonakilla operates a Buddy Programme for the first term each year. A rota is formed so that 6th class children can assist our new junior infants in managing the playground. They ensure that the younger children learn to play with their classmates and join in games. Each 6th class volunteer follows the Buddy Guidelines which are outlined clearly at the start of the term.

Green Schools

We celebrated our 8th Green Flag - Global Citizenship and Marine Environment - on the 29th of September. We hosted a flag raising ceremony for our whole school community to mark this significant occasion. It was a very proud day for Cloonakilla NS. We were honoured to share our ceremony with the Amber Flag Committee and celebrate their second Amber Flag.

Jonathan Jones, (Environmental Officer, Roscommon County Council) raised the flag with our Green

Schools Committee. Jonathan praised our Green Schools Committee and our school for all our hard work, dedication and the ongoing collective effort that has gone into making our school community, a model of environmental responsibility.

The Green Flag and the Amber Flag symbolize our school's collective efforts to build a better future, one that is greener, healthier and more compassionate. Well done to all involved!

Ciaran Hussey (Travel Officer, Green Schools Programme) visited our school at the end of October. He introduced our new theme Global Citizenship and Travel to all classes. The ultimate aim of this theme is to increase the number of students walking, cycling, scooting, and using public transport or carpooling to school. The programme will run for a two-year duration. There are 7 steps to each Green School theme. We will be focusing on step 2 – Environmental Review and Step 3 – Action Plan for the remainder of this term. 4th, 5th and 6th classes will take part in a Travel Survey this month. The Green Schools Committee will carry out a walkability audit and speed survey this month as part of our Environmental Travel Review with Ciaran Hussey.

At some point this term it would be greatly appreciated if parents/guardians could talk to the children at home about road safety. Road Safety will be a focus in our action plan for our travel theme in Cloonakilla NS.

Amber Flag

Gerard Tiernan, Pieta House, joined the Amber Flag Committee in raising their 2nd Amber Flag. This is a Pieta House initiative which promotes and develops positive mental health in our schools. Mr Tiernan urged the pupils to take some time in their daily lives to get some exercise and to take a break from their phones and social media platforms.

A new Amber Flag Committee was elected in October. The committee comprises of Mary Kate Kinneavy, Ellen Curley, Matthew Brydone, Kai Costello McCormack, Lauren Dully, Rachael Sammon Egan, Dylan Connolly, Mollie Rafferty, Sarah Brennan & Alicia Lapa. So far this year they have updated the Wellbeing Noticeboard and spun the

Wellbeing Wheel each Wednesday. They have also visited the Junior Classes to explain how the Buddy Benches work. The Amber Flag Committee will soon organise a Christmas Calendar and intend to use our Christmas Concerts as a part fundraiser for Pieta House. Other monies will go towards enhancing wellbeing resources in each classroom.

Active Breaks Challenge:

Active children learn better. Our school reinforces the message that children require 60 minutes of moderate to vigorous physical activity every day. We as a school are committing to an active break every day from November 18th for four consecutive weeks. Five minutes of movement between lessons can have a hugely positive impact on the teaching and learning in the lesson that follows. It helps children to adjust energy levels, restore concentration and self- regulate emotions.
